


20 Infant / first schools






177 Infant / first, junior & primary schools






181 Infant / first, junior, primary & middle schools


The Bigger Picture: UK Poverty 2025

It is a bleak read. It shows that:

- Over 1 in 5 people in the UK (21%) are in poverty 14.3 million people
- Of these, 8.1 million are working-age adults
- 4.3 million are children
- 1.9 million are pensioners.

Ofsted

- For inspections prior to September 2024, 9 Outstanding; 143 Good, 22 Requires Improvement; 4 Inadequate
- 36 schools inspected in the academic year 24/25 so far 17 x Section 5 (full and graded); 19 x section 8 (ungraded)

SIAMS

- 22 Inspections so far this academic year
- 42 @ 1, excellent ; 83 @ 2, Good ; 10 @ 3, RI
- From Sept 24 new judgements has 52 upholding their Christian foundation and 3 which are not
