St Margaret's Church

The church of St Margaret is situated in a wonderful rural position in the heart of the Blackmore Vale.

The oldest part of the church is the tower, dating to the 15th Century, the rest was rebuilt in 1872. The church is Listed Grade ll* and is mentioned in several books on Dorset.

Regular monthly services are held in addition to the usual Festival Services.

The Church has a ring of five bells the treble bell being a survivor of the ring of three, dating back to 1552.


The bells are rung regularly both for Sunday and Festival Services and the church has an active band of ringers who practice on a weekly basis. In recent years St Margaret's Church has become a teaching venue, for those wishing to learn the ancient art of bellringing.



St Luke's Church

The church of St Luke is situated in a prominent position in the charming rural hamlet of West Orchard and has a chancel which dates back to the late 15th Century. The rest of the church being rebuilt in 1876 by T H Wyatt. The Church is Grade ll listed and is used for regular monthly and festival services.

Urgent repairs are now required to prevent any further damage to the interior of this historic building.



The hole in the chancel roof at St Luke's Church, through which you can see the clouds passing by, proving the desperate need for urgent repairs.

Urgent Repairs Needed

To repair both roofs we need to raise a total of £20,294.

The greater portion of this amount is needed at Margaret Marsh, where nail fatigue has caused slippage on numerous rows of tiles, leading to serious concerns that the majority of the tiling on the chancel roof could slide off into the churchyard.

The photos show the urgency of the repairs needed.

We sincerely hope that you will be able to support our endeavours to repair the roofs of both churches.
